

# **PRESS RELEASE PRIMER**

# \*Campaign discipline is paramount: stay on message—always

## Why a press release?

- Launch a campaign (inform the electorate of who you are, why you're running for office, and a three-bullet description of your platform)
- Make it easier for the press to cover your candidacy—push information instead of press trying to pull information (or ignoring you...)
- Show you are a serious professional who is in the race to win the race

Press release basics (credit to https://thecampaignschool.com/how-write-winning-press-release/)

- Top of the press release should make it clear it's a press release. E.g. "MEDIA ALERT"
- Include date of release; consider adding "FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE"
- Include contact information (email & phone) for person in your campaign authorized to answer questions
- Announce purpose of release boldly in larger print—"Joe Smith announces candidacy for Williamson County School Board, District 12"
- Your first paragraph should be a summary of the entire release
- Subsequent paragraphs introduce your reason for running and your platform (three main points); paragraphs should be succinct and always on message
- Close press release with reminder of who you are & why running.
- End press release with three hashtags (###)
